



## **PADI SEARCH AND RECOVERY SPECIALITY WITH SCUBA ZONE**

As a 'recreational' Search and Recovery Diver you will have the ability, and the knowledge to methodically search for and recover objects underwater.

You will become a valuable diving companion to someone who may have lost, or dropped a piece of equipment or even an anchor!

The course increases your dive experience and enables you to conduct a search using search patterns and compasses, as well as successfully lifting a small object using a lift bag from the bottom.

The course is conducted at the weekend with four dives over the two days. During each dive you will perform simple search and recovery related tasks and learn how to perform important search and recovery skills.

This is a valuable course and with supervised instruction gives you confidence and experience.

## **PADI MULTI LEVEL SPECIALITY WITH SCUBA ZONE**

The purpose of the PADI Multi Level Diver Specialty course is to enable the student to plan, organise and make safe multi level no-decompression dives with the PADI Wheel or Dive computers (generally used more than tables), and to ensure that you know the most up to date recommendations for flying after diving, omitted decompression and the SAFE diver program.

You need only be an Open Water diver or equivalent to qualify for the course. The course involves two dives conducted in one day. The maximum depth will be according to your qualification level.

The course will improve your diving abilities, and provide you with additional diving supervision and experience.

Maximise your bottom time on all dives, while staying within your no-deco limits, and get the most out of your diving!

## **DAN O2 PROVIDER COURSE WITH SCUBA ZONE**

The DAN O2 provider course trains you to manage pressure related injuries (diving accidents) and also trains you to handle O2 units efficiently, you will be taught how to

help more than one injured Diver and provide Emergency O2 First Aid while activating the Emergency Services.

The course will increase your confidence as a diver and your care for other people and of course yourself.

The minimum age for the course is 12 years old and also you should have prior Medic First Aid training (see PADI MFA course).

Throughout the program you will be learning general skills to use in the unlikely event of an emergency, outlined in five modules as follows; anatomy and physiology, signs and symptoms of emergencies requiring oxygen, benefits of O2 in diving emergencies, dive accident statistics and emergency O2 delivery equipment.

Divers Alert Network is a non-profit diving organization and membership is available through Scuba Zone.

## **PADI WRECK DIVER SPECIALITY**

If you have completed the wreck dive option on your advanced course you will have touched upon the mysteries and wonder surroundings wrecks.

The PADI Wreck Diver Specialty course will improve your skills and increase your knowledge about the historical values of wrecks and the social and legal issues involved, as well as planning, organising and diving wrecks, including penetration.

On each of the four dives (conducted over two days at the weekend) you will learn and practice basic wreck diving skills and learn what to expect while diving on or around an underwater wreck including hazards, problems and procedures.

You will be supervised under safe and fun conditions, which will enable you to dive on wrecks found within your depth limitations in conditions as good as or better than those in which you are trained.

The Wreck Diver specialty will satisfy your curiosities about what lies beneath, buried in history, covered in artifacts and aquatic life. What's more, wrecks are fantastic for photography and videography.

## **PADI DEEP DIVER SPECIALITY**

Once you are an advanced diver you may wish to dive sites with a requirement of a deeper depth than 30 meters.

The PADI Deep diver specialty course is a safe, supervised introduction to deeper diving within the limits of recreational diving (no decompression stops).

The course will familiarise divers with skills, knowledge, planning, organisation, procedures, techniques, problems, hazards and enjoyment of diving between the depths of 18 meters and 39.5 meters, in a safe supervised environment.

You will be able to plan, organise and make no decompression dives up to 39.5 meters upon completion of the course.

The course involves four dives over two days at the weekend, during which your Instructor will assign tasks to be completed in the open water. The course will help you with your confidence and generally give you a better understanding of diving deep.

## **PADI ENRICHED AIR (NITROX) WITH SCUBA ZONE**

Enriched air is commonly known as 'Nitrox' and gives the diver the advantage of staying underwater for longer and is also healthier due to the higher oxygen content in the cylinder.

The purpose of the course is to familiarise divers with the procedures, safety protocols, hazards, risks, benefits and theory of no decompression diving with oxygen-enriched air containing 22% to 40% oxygen.

To start the course you must have the PADI Open watercourse qualification (or equivalent).

As will all PADI courses the majority of the knowledge development can be completed by independent study using both the enriched air diver manual and video. Before the diving component of the course you will also complete a practical application session, held at our Nitrox filling station where we will take you through the actual process.

## **DRY SUIT DIVER WITH SCUBA ZONE**

Dry suit diving is an essential part of Scuba Diving in any cold environment that is uncomfortable to dive in with a wet suit - i.e. The UK during the winter months!

The purpose of the PADI Dry Suit Diver speciality course is to familiarise divers with the skills, knowledge, planning, organisation, procedures, techniques, problems, hazards and enjoyment of diving with a dry suit.

Any PADI Open Water diver (or equivalent) over 12 years old may participate in the course. The first Open water dive of this speciality can be counted towards the Elective Dry Suit Dive in the PADI Adventures in Diving (Advanced) program.

The course is conducted over two days, a Monday evening orientation dive at our Central London pool if you haven't used a dry suit prior to one Saturday or one Sunday at an open water site. A short self-study package of a video and workbook means no lectures or exams.
